This trip is for Black and white Moss Agate and Wood. There are high quantities of this material present at on the surface and in the float. Access is on desert roads that are not graded. A high clearance vehicle is required and a 4x4 vehicle is recommended. Long wheel base vehicles are OK for this trip. The distance to this meeting site is approximately 8 miles from the club. Distance from the meeting site to the collection site is approximately 100 miles. Total off road mileage is approximately 20 miles both ways. Conditions at the site are for moderate hiking and limited material is available within 100 yards of the vehicles. Physical dangers include snakes and other normal desert conditions. There are huge quantities of material available a considerable distance from the parking area. This area was scouted in 11/2004 and conditions could have changed since that time. There is an age limit of 8 for this trip. All children are expected to be under constant supervision by parents or guardians at all times.

The trip leaders recommend that you bring gloves, spray bottle (water), rock pick, lunch, safety glasses, and adequate drinking water.

PLEASE DO NOT PICK UP OR DISTRUB ANY DESERT TORTESES FOUND IN THIS AREA OR IN THE DESERT AT ANY TIME.

No alcoholic beverages will be permitted on this trip.

WOVEN WIRE BRACELET



SUNDAY, JANUARY 22 1 PM

This woven wire bracelet is actually fairly easy to make. No soldering is required. A few basic tools are needed. The weaving is something I learned at Camp Paradise and the rest of the bracelet is from a book called "Woven Wire Jewelry" by Linda L. Chandler and Christine R. Ritchey. If you are interested, let me know. You can reach me at Mary Lou Flecher, 760-949-0796. Here is a list of supplies that you will need to have:

Materials:

22 or 20-gauge round dead soft silver wire for the woven part. I used 20 gauge. You will need approx 120 inches for a bracelet 6-6 ½ inches for an average woman's wrist so figure more if you want it larger or want extra width or just extra just in case!

12-gauge half-round, half-hard silver wire for the frame. Figure a minimum of 20-25 inches.

16-gauge half-round, half-hard silver wire for the wraps.

Optional....12-gauge double half round silver for the clasp... I didn't get the right gauge and made do with some of the 12-gauge that I used for the frame.

If you desire to purchase materials off of me, the cost will be \$35.00 for the entire project. Also, I will need payment before January 15, 2006.

Tools:

Wire cutters, Jeweler's saw, Rawhide mallet, Masking tape, Ruler, Hobby vise (available at Harbor Freight) or vise with padding to protect work, Wire wrapping pliers such as needle-nose, flat-nose, round-nose, stepped, nylon-jaw pliers

Note: if you wish to simply learn the weaving, practicing with copper wire is fine, 16 gauge or finer.
