ROCK OF THE MONTH

Obsidian

By Gayland Graves.

Obsidian is a glassy rock, it is volcanic glass and its name is said to come from a Roman who brought is from Lake Shalla in Ethiopia, the name of this Roman was Obsidian. Obsidian has the same minerals as granite, but cooled too quickly to crystallize. Obsidian has no crystalline structure, but it may contain rare tiny crystals of quartz, feldspar's, pyroxene and magnetite.

Being a siliceous glass it breaks with conchoidal fracture producing sharp slivers and should be handled with care. Obsidian has been used throughout ancient civilizations from jewelry to knifes, arrow heads and mirrors. They find dark nodules in Mexico, Arizona and New Mexico that are called Apache tears. There are many different types of obsidian, Snow flake, Mahogany, Sheen and Rain Bow, which all work well in the lapidary industry.

Bob was a lifetime member of the club and worked as the club photographer. Our thoughts and prayers go out to his wife, Faith and his family. He will be




