



#### (HOW TO) STABILIZE ROCKS.

- 1. You need two bottles (Costco nut mixes.)
- 2. Fill bottle (1) (about 1/3 full) with rocks.
- 3. Cover rocks with acetone.
- 4. Pour acetone from rocks into empty bottle (2).
- 5. Add resin (part a) from clear epoxy set (Harbor Freight item # 92665.)
- 6. Stir acetone resin completely.
- 7. Pour this mix back over the rocks.
- 8. Let stand a few days (stirring every day.)
- 9. Pour fluid back into second bottle.
- 10. Add hardener and mix completely.
- 11. Pour back over the rocks in the first bottle.
- 12. Let set one day.
- 13. Put rocks into the vacuum machine and pull 25 pounds of pressure for 2 minutes.
- 14. Remove rocks from liquid and place on plastic to dry.
