ROCK OF THE MONTH

A desert rose is a mineral formation of barite, selenite, or gypsum. These minerals become impregnated with sand as they are forming and crystallizing and a rosette pattern forms. Some of these formations do highly resemble roses, however, their texture is grainy and rough and not at all smooth. Desert roses are used as specimen stones in display cases for rock hounds and



collectors, as party favors, and large specimens can even be used as center pieces. The most common use of these beautiful stones however is by placing them in potted plants or in the garden especially around roses to increase production and health of the plants.

The selenite rose can be found in places like California, Libya, Mexico, Egypt, and Saudi Arabia, just to name a few. They are distinguished from the barite rose with their characteristics - the edges of selenite roses are sharper and the crystalline structure is less hard (on the Mohr scale of hardness) than the barite structure.

I have found a few over the years and have perhaps 8-10 in my possession at this time.

We Supply: Screens, screening tables, buckets, water, and a quart sized zip lock bag. We have a UV dark room to look through your washed material. Employees will be there to assist, demonstrate, and identify your finds. A port-a-potty is available.

You Need to Supply: Tweezers for picking up gemstones and a plastic apron or something to keep you dry. Bring your lunches, drinks, and lawn chair, A pop-up shade if you need it, rubber gloves if you need them. It's a muddy job screening for Benitoite, so bring your rain gear.

Rules of the Hunt: 1. Stay in the immediate area between the screening pile and parking lot. 2. Do not go into buildings unless permission is granted. 3. You are allowed to take home your zip lock bag full of finds. 4. If you find something too large for your zip lock bag and would like to purchase, we will negotiate a price. 5. Kids are allowed to play freely, please keep them close. 6. Pets are free. Keep them on a leash please. Sign-in Procedure: Park in the parking lot next to the white buffalo. Line up at the walk-in gate in front of the small cabin. If you concerned about not getting a screen, pay in advance, via Pay Pal.
