



By Law Changes

Article IV

Membership to the Victor Valley Gem & Mineral Club is open Section 2b to anyone regardless of age or place of residence. Membership Junior members (young people under the age of 18) must be sponsored by a parent, guardian, or member in good stand ing, and must be accompanied to meetings and on field trips by an adult member.

See Policy and Procedures for other requirements.

Previous Version:

The minimum age for membership is ten (10) years. Those between ten (10) and eighteen (18) years of age will be jun ior members without voting privileges.

Policy and Procedures Petrified Pups

Junior members are any member under the age of 18. Jun ior members Procedures under the age of ten (10) are not allowed to use any motorized shop Petrified Pups equipt. He/She must be supervised by his/her sponsor*.

Junior Members age ten (10) through age thirteen (13) must be right next to and supervised by his/her sponsor while working with any equipment.

Junior Members from age fourteen (14) through age seven teen (17) must be certified on the equipment and his/her sponsor has to be in the club house while the junior mem ber is using the equipment.

Junior Members at age eighteen (18) may become an adult member of the club by going through the regular member ship procedure.

Junior Members will not be allowed to use the silver proc essing, wax casting, burn out ovens, and/or mold making equipment.

*A sponsor is a club ember (usually a relative of the junior member) that is certified on the equipment that the junior member is using.

Resolving Conflicts Between Club Members Policy and Procedures

By Law Changes (continued)

Whenever there is a conflict or disagreement between club members these are the steps to take to resolve the conflict or disagreement.

- 1. The members involved should meet and discuss the situation among themselves in a quiet area with no one else listening or participating. If they cannot resolve the issue, they will then go to step #2.
- 2. The members concerned will go to the president or one of the vice presidents who will get 2 other board members, or club officers, together to discuss the concerns/ disputes in a quiet area with no one else listening or participating. If the issue still cannot be resolved, go to step #3. If it has to go before the board, a letter will be mailed out to the parties certified with return receipt.
- 3. The matter will be discussed at the next scheduled board meeting.
- 4. A vote/determination will be made at a meet ing of the Board members and that decision will be final.

Initial Complaint:

- a. No event over 6 months old can be brought before the board.
- b. The exact same concerns or disputes cannot be brought back again.
- c. At the Board Meeting, the Board can take disciplinary actions against either party involved in the dispute.
- d. There will be a complaint file kept and locked up in the office.

Returning Instructors Policies and Procedures.

If someone that was previously an instructor (and had to voluntary quit) and want to become an instructor again these are the procedures.

- 1. Fill out an instructor application and turn it into a club officer.
- 2. The instructors, at their next scheduled meet ing, will evaluate the application and make a recommendation to either accept or reject the application to the board.
- 3. The Board, at their next scheduled meeting, will either accept or reject the application.
- 4. The applicant will be notified of the decision of the Board.
- 5. If the applicant is accepted as an instructor they do not have to go back through the probationary period; but will immediately become an active instructor.

Time Limit on equipment: Policies and Procedures

NOTE:

There is normally no time limit on the use of our club Equipment but in the event that there is an other club member waiting to use the same equipment then these are the steps to be followed.

- 1. The member wanting to use the equipment will let the instructor on duty know what piece of equip ment they want to use.
- 2. The instructor will talk to the member currently using that piece of equipment.
- 3. If the member using the equipment is using only one piece of the same type of equipment they will have one hour to use the equipment and clean up the equipment. The equipment is to be cleaned (unless the next user agrees to accept the equip ment as is) and let the member waiting to use the equipment have the equipment.
- 4. If the member using the piece of the equipment is using more than one piece of like equipment then they can finish the current operation but cannot start another operation on the equipment. The current user must clean up the equipment unless the next user agrees to accept the equip ment as is.

The same type of equipment usually refers to using two or more slab saws. It is not limited to only this category of equipment.
