April Field Trip

First a brief note of thanks to Jim Fosse for leading the Tail Gate field trip out to the tri-color marble. I tagged along and brought up the tail and saw that we had quite a crowd show up. I'll have to find out from Jim just how many. Seemed like most were happy with their finds. I managed to chisel out a few fair size pieces that I hope will turn out nice myself.

Now on to April. The April field trip will be out to the Thulite outcroppings near Ludlow. Thulite is a pink rock that in hardness and appearance resembles a marble. It also works similar to marble. It is considered a type of Zoisite which is often carved like marble. This should be a great material for those of you that are getting into carving. It could also make nice spheres. The Thulite near Ludlow I have seen doesn't show as much pink as other samples I have seen. The material there tends to be green to gray-green with pink running through it. Sometime you find a dark green with pink dots or pink streamers. Some times its a lighter green with pale pink blotches. It can be a little tough to get a good polish on but still a lot of people like it.

Nearby I have found a site that has abundant chalcedony and gem grade Rhyolite that resembles jasper in float. We can hit that on the way out. These can be in fairly large pieces. The highest concentration of chalcedony I have seen.

We will be going out on Saturday, April 14, We will meet first at the club house at around 8 AM. We will swing by to pick up the Barstow crowd after that (about 8:50). The Diamond Pacific parking lot has been suggested as a meeting spot and that sounds good to me.

You will probably want to bring hammers and gads for the Thulite but that's not completely necessary. Bring your bag and hammer. The weather can be a little tricky so dress in layers. Bring your lunch and water. Bring sunscreen and protective glasses or goggles. We have already seen snakes so be on the look out for them.

Proposed By-law changes for 2012.

Article IV Section 1a (Title) Membership

Any adult may become a member by making written application and attending (3) consecutive regular meetings (extenuating circumstances considered), shall be introduced at each of the regular meetings by the membership chair, upon the acceptance of an initiation fee is payable which will pay the dues for a fiscal year plus a nametag. If the applicant has complied by the attendance rule (as stated above), and is accepted for membership at the June regular meeting or thereafter, the dues for the balance of the current fiscal year shall be reduced to (50%) of the normal fee. Dues for Junior members (10—18years) shall be (\$5) per year. Proposed change

Any adult may become a member by making written application and being approved by the board, will pay the dues for a fiscal year plus a name tag. If the new member is accepted for membership at the June regular meeting or thereafter, the dues for the balance of the current fiscal year shall be reduced to (50%) of the normal fee. Dues for Junior members shall be (\$5) per year.

Article IV Section 2a (Title) Membership

All applications shall be in writing and shall be signed by the applicant and (2) members of the organization who shall certify that the applicant is personally known to them and in their judgment, be a valuable member of the organization. The application must be approved by the membership committee before it is presented to the membership for final action. Upon being accepted, the applicant will become a member.

Proposed change

All applications shall be in writing and shall be signed by the applicant and submitted to the board. Upon approval and acceptance by the board, the applicant will become a member and will be presented at the next general meeting to the membership.

Article IV Section 2b (Title) Membership

The minimum age for membership is (10) years. Those between (10) and (18) years of age will be Junior members without voting privileges.

Proposed change

Age: Any kids up to the age of (18). Junior members will not have voting privileges. Upon reaching the age of (18) the person is eligible for full adult membership.

Article V Section 4 (Title) Dues

If a member is dropped from the rolls for non-payment of dues he may re-enter the organization after approval of the membership committee and final vote of the membership or by payment of all back dues <u>and a \$5 late fee.</u>

Proposed change

If a member is dropped from the rolls for non-payment of dues, he/she may reenter the organization with payment of the current year dues and a \$5 late fee.

Standing Rules Proposed Changes

#1 Scholarships

Establish (2) \$1,000 scholarships to be given annually.

Proposed change

Establish (1) \$1,000 scholarship to be given annually.

Policies and Procedures Proposed Changes

#9 Mileage reimbursement

A formula for mileage reimbursement was adopted by the board of directors on March 2nd 2010. Mileage will be reimbursed (i.e. for the Federation Director or the Field trip Wagon Master) using the following formula. The number of miles traveled divided by 17 mpg. The number of gallons is then multiplied by the average cost of gasoline per gallon at the time. (i.e. 170 miles travelled divided by 17 mpg = 10 gallons of gasoline @ \$3/gallon would equal \$30 which the member would be reimbursed.) All mileage requests must be approved by the board.

Proposed change

A formula for mileage reimbursement was adopted by the board of directors on March 2nd 2010. Mileage will be reimbursed only for the Federation Director or the Field trip Wagon Master (exploratory or scouting trips) using the following formula. (i.e. 170 miles travelled divided by 17 mpg = 10 gallons of gasoline @ \$3/ gallon would equal \$30 which the member would be reimbursed.) Anyone else needing mileage reimbursement must get prior approval from the board.

New Policies or Procedures.

#13 Active Instructors

Instructors must work a minimum of (2) shifts per month to be an active instructor. (Extenuating circumstances shall be considered by the board.)

#14 Instructor Club Use

Active Instructors can use the club on Mondays and Fridays. They can also use the club before or after their duty shift.

#15 Hiring Club Members

For the good of the club, the organization can hire club members only under the following conditions. (a) A specialized person is needed.

- (b) The member must meet all legal requirements. (i.e. license, bond etc.)
- (c) (75%) of the board members at the board meeting must approve the hiring of the individual.

(d) All hiring will be considered on a case by case basis.
