Terry Booth stated we got the sphere cups for the finer grit. Some cups are still on back order. Ceci Kawasaki thanked Carol Papner who has helped her every potluck. Don Pomerenke needs someone for April display, Cyndy Mandell will put in the display. We will not participate in the fair because we don't have the volunteers to take charge of it. Saturday we went to Barstow to tour the Diamond Pacific business. It was a good tour that thirteen members took part. On Sunday we went on another trip to the Victor Valley Museum. We met with them to see if we could put on our Gem Show at the museum. On Thursday's Candee Paredes will be doing Beading and Cyndy Mandell, air chasing. The board approved the purchase of a new oil cleaning machine. The filter cart cost about \$1200.00 and this will come out of the saw budget and we may not need to buy as much oil. Marilyn Pomerenke motioned for us to purchase this filter system, Terry Booth seconded. Motion carried. Victor Valley Gem Show By Cyndy Mandell, chairperson

The club's last gem show was held at the San Bernardino County Fairgrounds in 2009. The show was held yearly prior to that for many years. The shows used to gross approximately \$5,000 to \$6,000 with \$4,000 to \$5,000 being paid to the fairgrounds for the rental of the building. It was never a big money raiser, however it was our only fundraiser. In 2010 the fairgrounds raised its rental fee and we could not recover our overhead from the vendors so we had to cancel the show. We have not had another show since that time due to a lack of facilities. Now we have had an offer from the Friends of the Victor Valley Museum to use their facility free of charge. The Museum is interested in drawing more attention to their beautiful facility and they thought we might bring in a good crowd.

I am working closely with the museum to make arrangements and will be reporting on all progress made in the newsletter and at the club meetings. We are hoping for a November show this year or maybe next.


