



### FIELD TRIP - FEBRUARY 21, 2015

**Green Opal** occurs in a vein. The opal takes a good polish and makes up into attractive cabs and jewelry. It is also suitable for tumbling.





**Blue Agate** is quite hard and solid and excellent for polishing. There is very nice quality light blue agate occurring in vein. Hard digging is required to recover the material.



**Dendritic agate nodules** Look for the agate nodules protruding from the numerous basalt boulders (black, blocky). When many of these nodules are held against a grinding wheel and their outer surface removed, large, beautiful brown dendrites are exposed.



### ELMER PIERCY VICTOR VALLEY GEM AND MINERAL CLUB'S FOUNDING FATHERS PART -2-



In 1929, Elmer and Laulan welcomed their only child Rick into the world. Lamp Black hired Elmer in 1932. Lamp Black is a fine carbon dust used in many products at that time. Working around carbon black was a health risk because there were few systems preventing the fine dust from getting into the lungs. Elmer tried other work options, but times were tough and he came back to the Lamp Black plant.

Opportunity struck when the Lamp Black plant burnt down. The Williams purchased the plant and decided to rebuild in Casmallia near Santa Maria. Elmer selected to oversee the building and operating of the Lamp Black plant. Elmer moved his family to Casmallia and purchased the families first home in Santa Maria three years later for \$4,042.

In 1945 Elmer was offered a job to plan and build the Victorville Lime Rock plant. Having never done this before, Elmer rolled up his sleeves and went to work. He located and developed the quarry that bears his last name. The Piercy quarry is located off Stoddard Wells Road east of the I-15 Freeway. Next he built the original Victorville Lime Rock plant along "D" Street adjacent to the railroad and Mojave Narrows.

During 1945, he not only helped to construct the Lime Rock plant he joined with a group (Our Clubs Founding Father's) and helped to form Victorville Mineral Club which is now known as Victor Valley Gem and Mineral Club. (TO BE CONTINUED NEXT MONTH)

Petrified wood Jasper agate Blue agate Common green opal Dendritic agate nodules

**Petrified Wood** has a brownish-gray exterior giving it a rather chalky appearance. White, cream, and brown are the most predominate colors. Digging is required for this material. This material is good for tumbling and cabbing.



**Jasper agate** has a weathered green outside surface. Yellow and green streamers of jasper running through the agate remind one of a moss agate. It is found mostly in float. This material is excellent for tumbling and cabs.
