Elmer was very successful. According to Elmer's wife, "He saw things that he developed and made successful, misused, mismanaged and success faded." Elmer decided it was time to leave. He had given a lot to his work, which included looking at claims all over California, Nevada, and the Western United States. He covered sales, bought equipment and enjoyed his work and was very happy with the people of the Williams Company.

Rick Piercy says, "My grandfather was more than a miner, he was one of the first HAM Radio operators, W6CID, he collected coins, stamps, miniature liquor bottles, matches, trays, magazines and most important political buttons." Elmer's collection was one of the largest in the country and he was the first member of the American Political Items Collectors and was inducted into the APIC Hall of Fame. His collection of George Washington political memorabilia was one of the largest and finest in the country at the time of his death. His collection was donated to the Smithsonian. He also loved wood carving and wood inlay pictures. He painted and had his own dark room for his photography hobby.

Rick speaks very highly of his grandfather. He, like his grandfather is very involved in the Victor Valley. We owe a great debt of gratitude to Elmer Piercy for becoming a member of our organization and helping to make Victor Valley Gem and Mineral Club into the successful organization it is today. #### **VVGMC JANUARY 6, 2015 BOARD MEETING MINUTES**

**Terry Booth** called the meeting to order.

**Debbie Berresford** (Membership) Reported that we have thirty-seven (37) new members that will need to be certified.

**Tina La Bau** (CFMS Director) Reported that she received confirmation from Nancy Bird that three of our members were approved for Rockhound of the Year. The announcement will be made in the February CFMS Newsletter.

**Michael Fosse** (IT Director) PayPal is still having problem. Michael will be contacting them again tomorrow.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

March 2015

**Fencing**—Lia stated that her and her son are going to start patching the fence and they already have the materials.

**Sewer**—Rotor Rooter was called out at a cost of \$150. They found roots in the system. There are a couple of option, high pressured blast of water down the pipes or if pipes are broken the cost could be up to \$3000.

**Three Members** have been recommended for approval, two for training and one to be reinstated. Joe Collins, Juan Amaya for training and Ed Skidmore to be reinstated. Approved

**Terry Booth**-announced that he has asked Ruben Martinez to fill the vacant position of Board Member to which Ruben agreed. A motion was made that Ruben Martinez be accepted as a board member. Approved

The \$1,000 scholarship was added back into the budget per our by-laws. There was discussion about how to use the money given the challenges in finding qualified students from the local area to apply. It was suggested that the money go towards community education and the schools. A motion was made to send the matter to the By-laws committee for review and recommendation.

**Tina La Bau**— reported that she did a demonstration for 60-80 kids with toothpaste kits and everyday uses of rocks and minerals. It was a big hit with the children and only cost \$25. The money for these events will come from the Education Budget.

**A motion** was made to send the issue of membership dues for spouses of lifetime members to the Bylaw committee for review and recommendation. Until such determination is made, the membership fees for partners of lifetime members will pay \$10.

**Debbie Berresford**— stated that the AFMS convention in Quartzsite was coming up for the Scribes and Webmasters and that she would like the board to send her. After some discussion, Terry recommended that \$500 be moved from the saw room budget and into the bulletin budget to send Debbie to Quartzsite and cover a large deficit in her account.

**Treasurer's Report**—Craig Britt presented the budget. The board agreed to send the matter of Debbie's transportation and hotel cost to the finance committee to rearrange numbers prior to presenting at the General Meeting. 
