WIRE WRAPPING INTRODUCTION CLASS NOTES:

Wire wrapping introduction class by **Cory Beck.** November 5th, 12:30 starting time. Please be on time to cover as much material as possible. This is an overview of how to do wire wrapping. You will learn basic skills and use of tools. We will also review several popular styles of wire wrapping. What you need for class follows below.

TOOLS: Wire cutters, round nose plyers, chain nose plyers, flat nose plyers, pin file set, measuring tape, permanent marker, painters tape, or masking tape will work. **Note:** If you do not have tools the club has some that you can use for this workshop.

NEXT LEVEL TOOLS: Flex shaft or rotary (Dremel) tool and attachments, ring mandrel, rawhide mallet, ball peen hammer or similar. Used for cold forge style. Anvil or similar for hard metal surface.

MATERIALS: <u>Basic style</u>; Wire; sterling silver, but always buy <u>Dead Soft</u> wire. 22-gauge square wire - about 30" per project. 21-gauge square half round - about 36" per project. <u>Prong Style</u>; 16- gauge square wire, 21 gauge half round wire. <u>Cold forged style</u>; 14 or even 12 gauge round wire. <u>Stones</u>; Best to start with oval cabochons, about 1 - 1 1/2 inches tall. Free form cabs or even rough stones can be used.
