Not being in any guide book is a big plus, who knows what we may turn up! High clearance vehicles preferred. Also not a good area for children with broken glass, and rusted cans in some areas. Addition from Jake; I read somewhere that off to the west of the road we're taking is a playa and the hill above the playa has homestead ruins near the top, old home of the Boron Rock Shop owner's family. On this hilltop are several varieties of chalcedony and Jasper. Occasionally a geode fragment and druzy quartz.

WELCOME! A few weeks ago I made my second trip to visit the VVGMC Library. The first time I just went through a couple rows of shelves and found an interesting book on working with glass. I checked with Dave Duncan, and the way it works is quite easy. Get a book checked out by Dave or Lorie Cunningham. They will photograph you. While the book is in your hands the photo is in their files. Bring it back and the photo is deleted. It's that easy, as long as you are a member in good standing.

Always be sure to check the book, magazine or other media educational subject for damage and ask the check out person note it, so you will not be responsible for any pre-existing damage. Treat the material you borrow with great care. Keep away from children, pets, kitchen area where the items may fall into an area for potential damage or even become lost.

So, last week I decided to write up an article about the library and its holdings. Hopefully it will be of some interest and you'll check it out. Remember there are no fees.

There are five locked cabinets against the lower part of the back side wall. Each has a number of shelves lined with books and others having magazines, maps and other media items. Keep in mind that past librarians have all helped in some way to keep books separated into categories. On Saturday, Mary Lou Fletcher took some time to give me a more in depth look at what was there. Thank you, Mary Lou!

The very first door on the left is 80% educational on a variety of lapidary subjects. Jewelry design, faceting, gem cutting, wire wrapping, beaded jewelry, gem stones, rock tumbling, cutting rock, & overall subjects covering the scope of lapidary works. Behind door 2 are some interesting collections of other media, like CD's, VHS and complete book collections of geology going back millions of years show how things came to be. There are also some books on gold mining, and also some old GPAA (Gold Prospector's Association of America) guide books of their claims, and some Gem Trails booklets. Going through the last 3 doors, I found that things were a bit scattered with some different subjects that will need to be re-sorted into the first 2 doors. Then on a moveable cart at the far-left back wall are a collection of different magazines. Rock & Gem, Lapidary Journal, The Mineralogical Record, magazines mostly in binders and in date order for most. Want to see what the trends were in the 80's, 90's and turn of the century? Or get lucky and go back to the 1970's, and you might just find something from the 1960's that is ready to be-
