Kramer Hills Rocks! By Scott Gray Wagon master.



site trip, our group of nearly 20 cars headed out to see what we could find.


First stop: The palm bog area halfway up the old Pole Line Rd. On my previous trim I did a

The next stop was the old Key Kay Claim, well known for the various materials that are found there. With an abundance of float and several pits and holes to dig in, visiting rockhounds had quite a few choices on what to find. Some surface picked, others jumped in a pit, and some stared their own holes to dig. Guests Lisa and Kai exposed a section of nice green colored goodness in a hole they started on the north side of the hill. This was many of the attendees first time to Kramer Hills and all seem to be pleased with their finds.

Next we caravaned west about a half mile to the amygdule location. After about 5 minutes of walking the little agate and chalcedony nuggets started to appear. Many in the group had trouble locating them at first, but after finding the first one or two, cries of "here's another one!" resounded. There were plenty of amygdule's to go around and everyone said they were please with their "baby geode" finds. I found 3 small limb casts and at least two others found some too; Sue Brouwer turned up with a nice piece of petrified wood.


CA. High clearance vehicles preferred. There are several hills to search and the dry wash also produces. Bring pick, bucket, and a





AMETHYST, THE MODERN AND TRADITIONAL FEBRU-

ARY BIRTHSTONE, has a rich history and strong symbolic ties to love and spirituality. Due to its beauty, availability, and durability, this purple gem has become a very popular jewelry stone. You'll find them in everything from simple stud earrings to delicate bracelets to bold statement rings.

People have used amethyst for jewelry and decorative objects for thousands of years. The Ancient Egyptians associated amethysts with the god Osiris and carved amethysts into animal-shaped amulets. In the Old Testament book of Exodus, amethyst is one of the stones in the breastplate.of/ Aaron. The gemstone also appears as one of the foundation stones of the Heavenly City in the New Testament book of Revelation. Both these lists of Biblical gemstones contributed to the development of the modern idea of birthstones.

During the Middle Ages, royalty proudly wore amethysts because the color purple was associated with nobility. High-ranking priests also wore amethysts to represent piety. Amethysts were considered to be one of the "cardinal gems," along with diamond, sapphire, ruby, and emerald. They were often used in crowns, scepters, and other royal regalia. At this time, only people of the highest social status wore amethysts. Over the centuries, more sources of the colorful gem were discovered, making it more available and affordable. Today, the February birthstone is one of the top choices for jewelry stones.


