FIELD TRIP REPORTS FROM WAGON MASTER SCOTT GRAY

Super Rock Sunday! By Scott Gray Wagon master.

Sunday February 11, 2024 was the day of the club's field trip to the Early Man Site for agate, jasper, and elusive petrified palm root and palm root fiber the area is known for.



Meeting up at Eddies' World; itself a destination for all things fuel, treats, snacks; our large group of rockhounds signed in and gathered around a couple containers of assorted goodies I found on the pre-site visit. Small colorful samples of agate, jasper and palm root were passed around and admired, and also so attendee's could become acquainted with what could be found at the location. A few minutes later we rolled out in a 17 car strong caravan of excited rock hounds.



The Early Man Site has quite a history; prior to the archaeological dig it

was mined for bentonite, a whitish clay used primarily as a drilling mud in the oil and natural gas mining industry for lubrication and cooling purposes for the big drills. There is a lot of information online about the area and it's a rewarding read. It's also an easily reached site with a mostly maintained road and a couple short sandy spots. Early Man is a vast area and this section has seen little recent rockhound activity as it was off limits for collecting for many years and was behind a locked gate until BLM cleaned it up and reopened it for the general public. After parking everyone fanned out in different directions; some to the washes to the south, some to the small hills to the east, and others along the ridge to the north. While there is literally tons of material here, much of it being a bland brown color, with a keen eye and patient searching more



colorful and high quality pieces can be obtained. The hillsides, with fresh cuts and still muddy from the recent rains tended to be the best producers. Everyone turned up with rocks they liked; red/orange swirled jaspers, green/ yellow jaspers, and brecciated type pieces. One attendee found a nice piece of common opal; our prize was a nearly basketball sized piece of top quality palm root filled with eyes and rootlets found by Sasha Gray. Truly one heck of a bragging rock!

Around 2 pm we called it quits at the Early Man and about 10 of the attendees made part 2 of the days trip: a visit to The Two Sisters rock yard! Diane and Lesley graciously

opened up their yard for field trippers to peruse their huge assortment of cuttable material, all for the bargain price of a dollar a pound! Sasha and I purchased a huge piece of petrified wood, some small but showy moss agates, and neat piece of green palm root. Others purchased quality cutting



materials to their liking; there is something for everyone here with a little searching. Overall a very successful trip on a Super Bowl Sunday with several new members, and guests from Los Angeles, Long Beach, Taft, and even Las Vegas! A lot of fun was had by all! A special thank you to Dave Duncan for setting up The Sisters trip and also to Anne Musick and her son Simon for helping me run the caravan. FEBRUARY FIELD TRIP REPORT, BY SCOTT GRAY

Stoddard Wells, Tailgate Show by Victor Valley Gem and Mineral Club. Field Trip

ON Saturday, March 9th will be the club field trip to the Tri-Color Marble Quarry for the brecciated dolomitic limestone and marble the location is well known for. This is an easy to work material that is readily available in large pieces and quantities at the location. This trip is in conjunction with the VVGM Tailgate. Meet up will be on Stoddard Wells Rd immediately east of the entrance to the Tailgate parking area and there will be a large sign in place to designate the meet-up area. Bring a bucket, spray bottle, rock hammer and, if you want to break pieces off boulders, a sledge and chisels. While being a somewhat soft material it is surprisingly difficult to break the boulders apart. Smaller pieces are readily available so the heavy equipment isn't necessary for most collectors. THIS IS A 4WD TRIP ONLY. The road is a tough one. If you don't have 4wd arrive early and you should be able to hitch a ride with someone who does have 4WD. See ya there!

Note that this is also the site for Antique Verde Marble: Here's a short write up that explains how popular it was around the turn of the century, 1900's.

It was the 1890s when the management of the old Palace Hotel in San Francisco was seeking the most attractive marble that could be found to redecorate the interior of the palatial hostelry, among the stone selected was a handsome sulphur yellow and lime green marble veined in chocolate and cream—from the Verde Antique quarry 17 miles northeast of Victorville, on California's Mojave Desert. The old quarry, located on the treeless highlands which slope down to the Mojave River, is no longer being worked commercially, but it remains a popular hunting ground for rockhounds in quest of attractive cutting stone. The quarry's name was derived from the ancients' term for dark green marble veined in black-Verde Antique. The Italian marble's hue is much deeper than the marble found on the California desert.

The stone selected was a handsome sulphur yellow and lime green marble veined in chocolate and cream. Image to right. Sample from Land-Sea Discovery Group.

ELMERS BOTTLE TREE RANCH, by Jake Brouwer

So, you're out on the in the lower Mojave Desert. Hesperia, Victorville, and Apple Valley is where you live, shop and go out for a nice dinner. But, you really would like to explore and see something different. Well, I've got the place for you for a nice 1/4 day jaunt. Weird, quirky and innovative thoughts come to mind, from the time you park out front, to clearing the entrance

gates and walk inside. Elmers Bottle Tree Ranch is the place and wonderment is the attraction.

Susan and I have traveled this road many times, visiting Oro Grande on the National Trails Highway. West of Victorville, route 66, seeing amazingly large cement plants, crosses on the roadside that memorialize the unnamed victims of unnecessary speed on the twisty Route 66 and many more signs of economic failures, delipidated buildings, then some nice revitalized antique stores with an amazing array of treasures within on the southern side of the road. From there, Lots of empty land, small homesteads and finally off to the left, a glimmer of one mans quest and dream, to build something, in the beginning, simply a place to keep his massive bottle collection.

His name is Elmer Long. Son of Elmer Long Sr. Growing up with his dad, they went hunting in the desert for treasures, and find them they did. Old mining camp dumps were quite numerous in those days of the 1950's. When they found their first bottles, it started a 30 year collection, which Elmer Junior inherited and brought to Oro Grande on the Mother Road.

Elmer unlike his dad, Elmer wanted to do something with the 1000's of bottles they had collected. Dad just collected and let things sit, but a younger Elmer had to be creative with them somehow. Starting by hanging a bottle from a wood post and continuing on until he soon realized he needed more and went out searching the old camps again. His Dad had save the maps of places they hunted over the year to find more.

In 2000 he started building his "bottle tree ranch." It has grown to be 2 acres, and 200 bottle trees. Elmer died in 2019 at the age of only 73 years. But he had created his vision and now people from all over the world stop in to

see this curiosity at 242 National Trails Highway, past Oro Grande, CA.

It is free to enter and open sunrise to sunset. Gate in front is usually open and worth the time to drop in . Elmer's family has taken over the ranch, and have a wishing well on site near the back for donations.

It you love road side attractions, with rust, bottles of all colors, old road signs, whimsical treasures like typewriters, old rifles, weather vanes, a jeep, steering wheels, license plates, and more you'll fall in love with this place and end up stopping every time you're in the area.
