

Cyndy Mandell visited Victorville's Discovery School on Wednesday, February 23, 2011 to give a presentation and demonstration to their second graders. Four groups of 60 second graders took part in the presentation made on behalf of the Victor Valley Gem and Mineral Club. The children got an overview of different kinds of rocks and where they came from and they participated in an abbreviated science lesson on the density of rocks. Each students was able to drop a rock in a bucket of water to see if it sank or floated and come up with a hypothesis: "All rocks sink". This was followed by dropping a large chuck of pumice into the bucket to disprove their hypothesis since the pumice did not sink. Each student got to select between a piece of opal from the Tiffany mine or a piece of agate to keep. The presentation was a reward to second graders who had met their Accelerated Reading Goals.
