



#### Pickle Pot Rules

House Rules: Copper and Brass are to be pickled in their own pot.

Silver and Gold will be pickled in their own pot.

Very Importantly: Absolutely no Iron or Steel shall be introduced to either the silver/gold or brass/ copper pickle pots as this will cause problems.

Do Not use any other than the copper tongs to retrieve your metals from the pickle pots. No use of the steel tweezers as this will cause a copper plating onto the silver or gold, Also do not stir the solution with anything other than the copper tongs.

Do Not use a wire brush with steel wire as this may also introduce iron/steel to the pickle solution.

Do Not allow any source of iron or steel in the pickle solution. This includes the steel shot from the cleansing tumbler.

Take great care not to allow any iron/steel particles to enter the pickling solution. This includes the mounting pins, debris from third hands, and other tools.
