Here is a compilation of the replies I received, on and off of the Forums. Based on everything I have received and have read, Pella-A cutting oil seems to be on the way out and many responders have switched to a "food grade" mineral oil, which also seems to be (if purchased right) half of the price we've been paying for the Pella-A. From the different writings, I get the impression that these choices were based on: 1)

health & safety; 2) cost; and 3) ease of availability. Please read on:

On Sunday, September 8th I had the pleasure of attending the MASSC (Metal Arts Society of Southern California's Demo Day at Long Beach City College. The picture is of some spiculas made by Angelina Ciulik for a music video of a group called 9 Inch Nails with Rihanna. These are made of 26 gauge copper and hammered into an anticlastic shape to fit on the ends of your fingers.

Approximately 100 people attended the demo day that featured five artists. We were quickly divided into groups and moved to a classroom where Betsy Manheimer displayed a number of different hammers and explained there uses. She also demonstrated how to take an inexpensive hammer and make your own patterns on it using grinding discs or diamond files. Next was Brad Smith the author of Bench Tips for Jewelry Making displaying and explaining some of his short cuts for metal smithing. Next was Corliss Rose showing how she works with Polymer Clay and last was Michelle Ross demonstrating her enameling work.

For the \$20.00 fee my lunch was provided, hand-outs were given, and for a donation they held a raffle where a Foredom was given away along with some expensive hammers, a circle cutting machine, a Bonnie Doon hammer, and many other expensive prizes.
