



September Double Field Trip Lavic Jasper/Flame Agate Saturday, September 28, 2013 08:00am

These two sites are fairly close to one another and I feel it is possible for club members to pick up many quality pieces over the morning. The road into the Lavic Jasper site is part of the railway line and is kept graded and passable. The road to the Flame Agate area is part of the power line road and is also kept graded and passable. Two wheel drive vehicles should have no problem making the entire trip. There is minimal walking at the Lavic site. Vehicles will be able to park right next to where jasper can be found. Rain water has cut a channel here, exposing fine pieces. They are small, but full of color. Much occurs in float, but if you bring a pick and shovel, one might find large pieces. Walking at the Flame site will be greater. The map shows 2/10ths of a mile to the site from the road so be prepared. Overall, bring water, a lunch or snacks, and sunscreen and a hat as there will be a little summer holding over. Mileage is near 90 miles one way. Meet @ Barstow. Take Barstow Rd. exit, turn right and into gas station. Pizza Hut is in the back. Meet there @ 8am. All will be asked to sign a roster and a release form. All children must be kept under supervision. Alcohol is not permitted on the trip. UFO's taking the wagon master for a quick ride around the galaxy is okay....
