



Discussion took place regarding increasing shop fees. Curtis feels some members have low income and doesn't feel it's warranted. Terry spoke about members mistreating the equipment. Brett asked how many years of blades do we have. Connie thought the fee was for coming to the shop but it's only a fee if you use the equipment. Lia feels she is being penalized for others who misuse the equipment. Corey feels the club is well off financially and doesn't need to raise the fee. Curtis motioned to reject the fee increase, Frances seconded, motion carried.

Minutes of the May 7, Board Meeting

Corey will put a list together of people who have dropped their membership in order to mail out postcards. Cyndy will do a demo on how to photograph your jewelry May 21st. June 18th Ed night will be Terry doing a demo on the pre-former jig for spheres and Cvndy will also demo the jump ring maker that night. Bank balance is \$10,637.52 through the end of April. Cyndy needs help taking equipment and setting up for the fair on Monday May 20th. Meet at the club at 9:00am. Cyndy only has 21 passes to hand out for the Fair. She is finding it hard to fill the newsletter and will probably cut out 4 pages. If anyone has articles please send them to Cyndy. The CD's came due yesterday and we have 6 days to decide what to do with them. Lois suggested that we pull them both out and decide what we want to do with them. Anne suggested to pull it out and immediately deposit into our savings and put some of it back in to a CD at a later date. Terry motioned to pull the CD's and put them in the savings and then possibly put a portion in a CD at our July board meeting. Don seconded. Motion carried. Last general meeting it was discussed that some members are on fixed incomes. Ed's suggestion is to have a 6 month moratorium on shop fees but our by-laws state we charge a shop fee. Or a \$1.00 fee for shop fee for a period of time. Anne is hesitant to reduce or put a moratorium on fees. If we have greater demand then we have a greater wear and tear on the equipment. Terry thinks we need to have a sponsor for new members. Lois feels we don't have enough members to volunteer to be sponsors. Anne would like to have the President address the general membership in regards to what they want in this club. Anne suggested a prepaid shop card. Anne and Brett will work this out and present options to the board next meeting.


Meeting Dates
